In the days ahead, we try to work on our proposals and reflect on important mobility issues.

The phenomenon of mobility, in conjunction with the evolution of the means of communication and transport, transforms our way of life and contributes to the formation of "horizontal identities". As the writer Amin Maalouf suggests: "Things have changed so much in a few years that we feel infinitely closer to our contemporaries than to our ancestors. Would I be exaggerating if I said that I have more in common with a passer-by chosen at random in a street of Prague, Seoul, San Francisco or Barcelona, than with my own grandfather? Not only because of appearance, clothes, habitat or tools that surround us but also because of moral concepts, ways of thinking. And also because of beliefs. (...) In short, each of us is the deposit of two inheritances: one, "vertical", comes from our ancestors, the tradition of our village, ofour religious community; the other, "horizontal", comes from our time, our contemporaries. It is the latter which, in my view, is more determining, and is more so each day that goes by."
